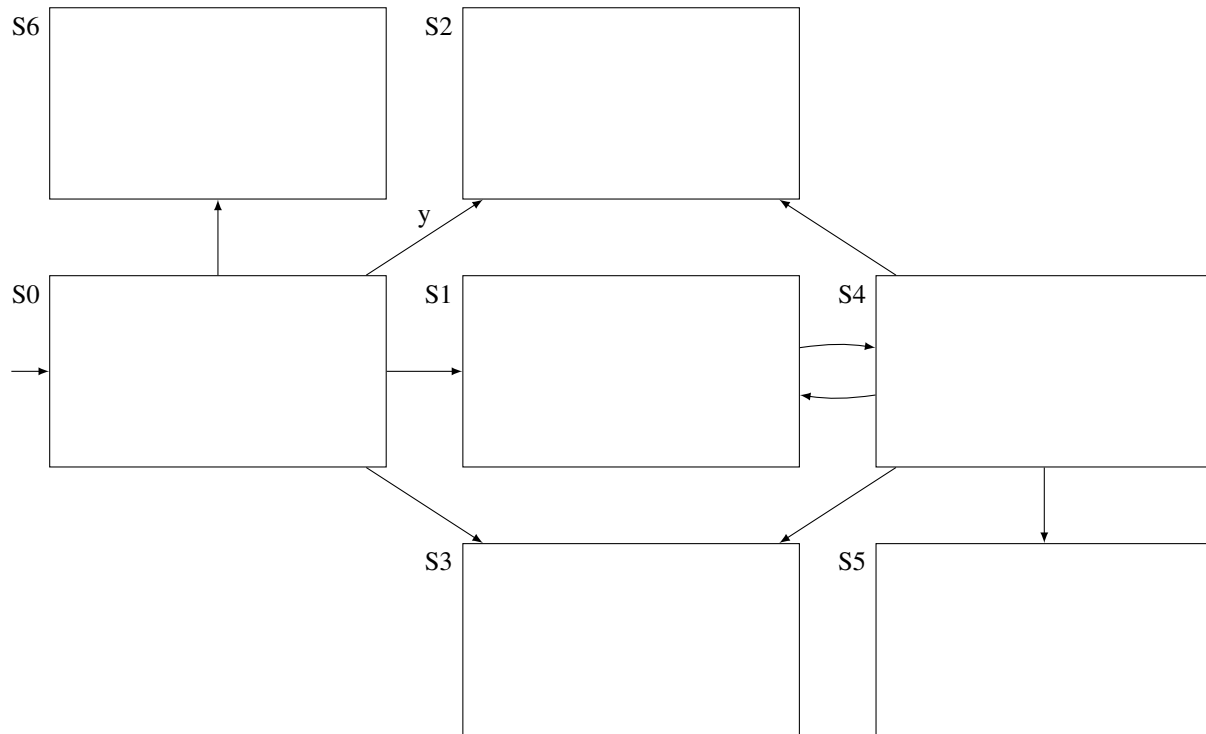

Show function arguments being passed on the stack, local variables, previous frame pointers, return addresses, and the current stack and frame pointers. You do not have to include space for registers.

void foo(int a, int b)
{
    int x = a + b;
    int y;
    bar(a, x);
}

void bar(int c, int d)
{
    int y = c + 3;
    int z = d * 2;
    baz(y + z);
}

void baz(int q)
{ ... }
```
